SOUTH BRUNSWICK TOWNSHIP ADDS ADDITIONAL VETERAN TO STREET NAMING HONORS

South Brunswick Township, NJ (MAY 14) – South Brunswick Township is pleased to announce that an additional local veteran will be honored this spring as part of the Veterans Recognition Street Naming Initiative.

Roy E. Menghi, a 96-year-old Korean War veteran, will be recognized for his service to our country with a street sign dedication on **May 24, 2025, at 11:00 AM, at the intersection of Kendall Road and Palmer Road**. His name will be added to a secondary street sign on an existing municipal road, joining the four previously announced honorees.

Roy's distinguished service during the Korean War exemplifies the bravery and commitment of our nation's veterans. The Township is proud to include him in this year's recognition and to help ensure that his legacy is remembered by future generations.

This update is part of the Township's ongoing Veterans Street Sign Program, which honors Wartime Veterans who served in the United States Armed Forces and were honorably discharged. The initiative seeks to raise public awareness and express gratitude for the sacrifices made by local veterans.
